

## Pastor's Pen

### *Who we are and who we are becoming!*

Dear Congregation,

There is a lot in a name. Your name identifies you, and lets the world know who you are, setting you apart as uniquely you. It can identify your family and ethnic background, and other things like your family's convictions, quirks, and obsessions. If people know you, just hearing your name will remind them of who you are, what you look like, your character, your relationship with them. It works at the church and business level too. What do names like "McDonald's," "The Eagles," or "St. Peter's" evoke for you?

On January 5, 2025, at 10:00 AM on the first Sunday of the new year, we plan to inaugurate our new name: **Christ Fellowship Church**. There will be one combined worship service at 10 AM, with Holy Communion and the Wesley Covenant Renewal service, with a **Celebration Reception** to follow. We want the whole church to attend as we celebrate our new name together.

This new name marks a day of new beginnings, new associations, and new expectations for the future. We should be very clear about why the new name is necessary: We are shedding an old identity we have already begun to leave in spirit. It no longer properly represents who we are. We are forgetting what lies behind and moving forward to what lies ahead.

With the new name, we are boldly declaring who we are and who we want to be. We are a church committed first and foremost to the Lordship of Jesus Christ and to the final authority of his Holy Scripture, the source of true apostolic faith once delivered. We are committed to both right belief and right living according to scriptural standards of holiness, rejecting compromise with the world's standards, living in obedience to Christ, and to being a church where genuine Christian disciples are made, and God's love is freely shared with others. Let's embrace our new future together with one heart and mind in Christ Jesus our Lord!

We are changing church signs, the website, our advertising, letterhead, brochures and business cards to reflect the new name. Because we are still in the lawsuit, we cannot yet change our legal name on the deed and registered with the courts and the UMC.



However, there is nothing in UM discipline which forbids changing those other things or publicly using our new “*Doing Business As*” name. That is what we are kicking off on January 5.

Here are some things to know:

- 1) We have a new website: [www.havencfc.org](http://www.havencfc.org). The old site will still work for some time, pointing people to the new site.
- 2) The Trustees have ordered a beautiful new white lit cross for the steeple to replace the old UM cross-and-flame.
- 3) The Trustees have covered the old street signs and are ordering new signs for the outdoor marques.
- 4) We are looking for a new logo for the church letterhead. We are happy to consider anyone’s creative vision for this and have received one nice entry so far. Let’s get prayerfully creative as we prepare for our future together.
- 5) We will issue a press release about the name change.

Hope to see you all on January 5 for our name-change celebration!

## Confirmation Class of 2025 Organizing



Do you have a child who is ready for confirmation class? Confirmation is a serious discipleship class which takes young people through the basics of Christian faith and helps them make a personal commitment to Jesus Christ. It is for children who were baptized as infants but have never made a public commitment to Christ, for children who have never been baptized but are seeking Christ, and for youth baptized at a later age who have not yet been trained in Christian discipleship basics.

Youth will need to be at least 12 years old and in middle school or older to begin. This is the age when we believe they are old enough to know the difference between right and wrong, and to take responsibility for their faith and relationship with God.

This year's Confirmation Class will begin on February 12<sup>th</sup>, running on Wednesday nights through early Spring at 6 pm. The Class will be viewing the new *Youth Alpha Course Series* (just redone in 2024). This is a very exciting opportunity for young people to confirm their faith and prepare for a true walk with Jesus Christ that will last for the rest of their lives and into eternity. **Winter Health and Safety**

The cold of winter, along with ice and snow, creates many challenges to our health and safety. It includes the peak season for respiratory illnesses. Contaminated respiratory droplets travel more easily in the cold dry air of winter. That coupled with people congregating indoors, allow viruses to be shared more readily. If not feeling well, stay home. Most respiratory illnesses can be helped by resting, drinking plenty of fluids and taking over the counter pain relievers and cough suppressants. If your symptoms become severe seek medical attention. If you sneeze or cough, do so into the crook of your arm, NOT YOUR HANDS! Wash your hands often with warm water and soap (a 20 second thorough wash) or use hand sanitizer. Do not share utensils, cups, food, clothing, towels, or other personal items. Disinfect high touch areas in your house and work area. Use of a humidifier may also be helpful.

When you do need to go outside. Dress appropriately. Cover your head with a hat or hood, making sure that your ears are protected. Use a scarf to protect your lower face. Dress in loose layers of clothing with properly fitted shoes or boots if indicated. Protect your hands with gloves or mittens. Limit your time outdoors in cold, wet, wintery weather. Frostbite can develop in minutes dependent upon conditions.

With winter comes snow (at least in our region)! If you need to shovel, be sure to stretch and warm up your muscles. Bend at the knees and use your legs to lift the shovel to avoid sprains and strains. If you become tired, take a break, keep hydrated, and proceed in increments that are tolerable.

When using a snowblower, be extra cautious. Keep children and pets away while operating it. Be sure to turn it off before clearing any snow jams.

Take your time walking outside, be aware of ice and snow-packed surfaces that increase your risk of falling. Take small penguin type steps when on slippery surfaces. Be especially careful exiting your car. It is a good idea to hold onto the car door while exiting your vehicle.

Make sure your car is winter ready for travel. Replace worn tires, check antifreeze levels, and keep at least a half a tank of gas in your car to help prevent freezing. Carry emergency supplies and extra warm clothing in case you should become stranded. Tell others about your travel plans , route, and expected date of return.

Stay safe and warm over the winter season. Enjoy the flakes of snow as they dance to the ground and blanket the earth.




